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Orientation in Primary Education for the Development of Competences from Transdisciplinarity

## **ABSTRACT**

Developing pedagogical activities encourages the use of the skills and competencies that the teacher must establish once they have begun to develop their practice. This involves a commitment and responsibility with the use of alternative strategies, plans and programs to strengthen the vision of social and community integration, and that the student located at the primary education level has alternatives and thus consolidates educational praxis.
